► **Tyler Scott**, 18, of Emmaus, Pennsylvania, was second in the 2023 MotoAmerica Supersport Championship with four wins. He also won the NEMRR 100th Loudon Classic, earning a \$55,000 cash purse. He will continue to chase the MotoAmerica Supersport Championship in the 2024 season.

► **Jesse James Shedden**, 15, of Helendale, California, took third in the 2023 CIV Junior Aprilia Sport Production Championship with three wins and five podium finishes in 10 races. He also had two top-seven finishes in his MotoAmerica Junior Cup debut. He plans to continue in the same series this season.

► **Maxwell Toth**, 17, of Belmont, California, (now in Barcelona, Spain), earned a 13th place finish in an FIM Junior Moto2 European Championship race at Portimao and was 24th in the Championship standings. He will race the same series but switches to the AGR Team in 2024.

► **Max Van**, 18, of Shelby, Michigan, placed third in the 2023 MotoAmerica Junior Cup Championship with four podium finishes. He is now racing a Suzuki GSX-R750 in the 2024 MotoAmerica Supersport Championship.

► **Hank Vossberg**, 13, of De Pere, Wisconsin, co-rode to an N2/WERA National Endurance race win in his class and took multiple sprint race and Championship wins with WERA. He wants to win the N2/WERA Lightweight National Endurance Championship this season.

► **Owen Williams**, 16, of Lake Forest, California, won five CVMA Winter Series races and placed 14th in the 2023 MotoAmerica Supersport Championship with a best race finish of seventh in New Jersey. He's continuing in MotoAmerica Supersport in 2024.

► **Kayla Yaakov**, 16, of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, finished third in MotoAmerica Supersport Race One in New Jersey, becoming the first woman ever to finish on a MotoAmerica Supersport podium. She also finished seventh in the 2023 MotoAmerica Twins Cup Championship with two podium finishes and won three Yamaha bLU cRU R7 Cup races in Spain. She is now racing full-time in the 2024 MotoAmerica Supersport Championship. **RW**



That brought his all-time Daytona 200 race mileage total to 3,903, moving him past the late Rick Shaw (a one-time Mileage Record holder) for third on the all-time list behind Ricky Orlando (4,231 miles) and the late John Ashmead (4,579). Fania is the only racer in the top 10 of the All-Time Mileage list who is still actively competing. To put that into perspective: If 16-year-old Kayla Yaakov, who finished 11th this year with 56 laps and 196.56 miles covered, completed all 200 miles of her next 22 Daytona 200s she would break the All-Time mileage record in 2046, when she would be 38.

Richie Escalante set a new All-Time Daytona 200 Lap Record at 1:47.833, eclipsing his own mark of 1:48.133 set in 2023, and a new Race Lap Record of 1:48.625, breaking Blake Davis' 1:49.635 set in 2023.



King Of The Baggers rookie Troy Herfoss broke the All-Time Lap Record and Race Lap Record in his debut. In qualifying, Herfoss lowered Kyle Wyman's All-Time Lap Record of 1:50.563 to a 1:49.987, and then after breaking Wyman's Race Lap Record of 1:50.864 with a 1:50.211 in the Mission KOTB Challenge dash for cash, Herfoss lowered it to 1:50.004 during Race Two.

Tyler O'Hara set a new All-Time Lap Record in RSD Mission Super Hooligans, a 1:52.781, topping Jeremy McWilliams' 1:53.579 set during Race Two in 2023. Cory West's 1:53.376 also eclipsed McWilliams' mark as a new Race Lap Record.

Gus Rodio broke Stefano Mesa's All-Time Twins Cup record of 1:55.545 with a 1:55.193 during qualifying. Mesa's mark was also a Race Lap Record, and Rodio also beat that with his 1:55.413 during Race Two. **RW**
